






# CHS Library Newsletter - Issue 54

#### Suitable for age 12+



### Sora Reading Recommendations


The 2024 Olympics are about to commence and for all you sport mad fans out there Sora has an amazing collection of sport and recreational E and audio books to choose from free of charge.
